## V. Old Business

### A. Dress Code

Dr. Bailey came to us the legal and religious reasons and constitutionality for removing the following from the dress code. Jatziri and Dena spoke up saying could she revisit these because they would like our school to stand out and keep the traditional rules. They feel things are being watered down. Dr. Bailey said she will revisit it and get back to us.

1. Boys' hair shall be cut to rest above the top of the ear and the collar of the shirt.
2. Clipper cuts are permitted.
3. Extreme hairstyles (e.g. Mohawks, Fauxhawks, asymmetric cuts) are not permitted.
4. Only girls may wear pierced earrings - one per ear, stud type, fitting flat to the earlobe.

## VI. New Business.

### A. Reopening of School

1. Hybrid continues with online for all on Wednesdays.
2. All ALTS students are being taught by ALTS teachers. We have a few additional students from other schools in a few of our online classes.
3. Cafeteria is one grade level at a time and only 2 students per table, all facing forward.
4. Classrooms are using the playground in zones to keep cohorts.
5. Bathrooms - only two allowed in at a time. 3m hooks are on the doors. Students hang their lanyard on door so students know if they can go in. A social distance waiting line is outside of door.
6. Strict cleaning standards are happening in all areas of the school. Each classroom has a clipboard hanging with specifics on cleaning items each day.
7. Drop off and pick up are running smoothly from the school's point of view.
8. We are in the process of getting a program that will allow quicker check in of parents when they drive through and less disruption in classes. (PikMyKid)
9. Onsite program continues
10. Children are coming to school and seem very happy to be back on campus. Teachers are happy too!

Melanie was concerned that the kids are not getting as much learning during the hybrid model.

Sal commended our school and district on how well we are keeping the kids safe and that we are cleaning very well.

- B. Guild selling embellished shirts** – some concern over whether it is ok to have embellishments on spirit shirts since “embellishments” are not allowed in the dress code.
- C. Individual Student Photos (Like Dorian)** – not off the table. Rhonda and Jennifer Hayward are looking into it.
- D. Virtual Curriculum Night** – parents would like to have a curriculum night as we usually do, but just virtually and parents could be given a link and join if they would like to. Another parent said that they would be happy with an email or powerpoint with curriculum night info.
- E. New playground equipment** – there was concern about wood chips. But Rhonda told us that they are made of fibers, not actual wood. It is softer upon impact, and easier to maintain. Parents and teachers say it is also good because less cats peeing in the sand, less mud than the sand and less sand in shoes for the kids. Win for the parents!
