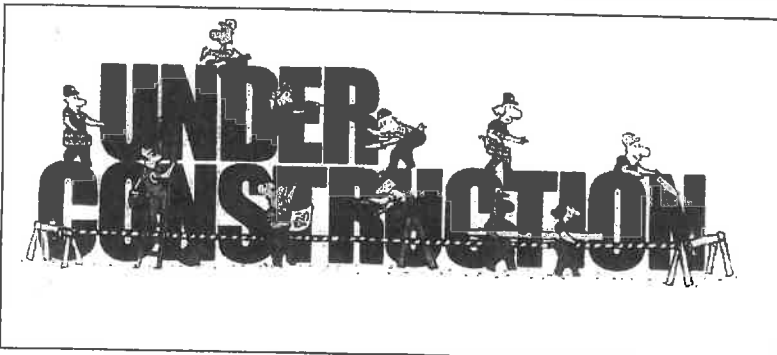

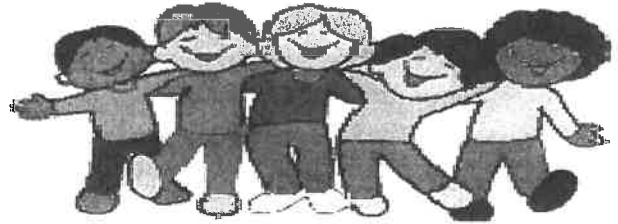

Health Office News



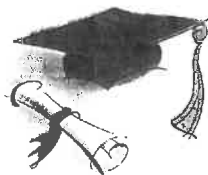
